Students must complete an academic research paper of high professional quality concerning an issue in child advocacy law. The paper must be of sufficient depth and quality to satisfy, and may be used to satisfy, the Law School's upper level writing requirement. This paper requirement may be fulfilled by an independent writing project or the writing requirement for a course or for law review/journal. Advance approval of the topic by one member of the Child Advocacy Certification Committee is required.
