Overview of the Legal Studies Minor Requirements:

1. At least **24 total credits**, including:
2. Core Courses: at least 8 credits
3. LAW/CRES Electives: at least 8 credits
4. Campus Partner Electives: at least 8 credits (*see reverse side*)
5. Upper-Division: at least 12 of the 24 total credits must be upper-division (300/400 level)
6. All LAW/CRES courses and Campus Partner Electives **must be passed with a letter grade of C- or better**.

Requirement	Explanation	Completed?
Core Course	Complete two of the following: LAW 101, CRES 101, LAW 102, and/or LAW 202.	
Law Elective	Complete 8-credits from any LAW or CRES course (listed below).	
Campus Partner	Complete 8-credits from Campus Partner Electives (listed on page 2).	
Upper-Division	At least 12 of the 24 total credits for the minor must be from 300 or 400-level courses.
