THE MARY S. LAWRENCE AWARD

The Mary S. Lawrence Award recognizes an individual for a combination of pioneering scholarship and innovative curriculum or program design. The award is named for Professor Emerita Mary S. Lawrence, founding Director of the Legal Research and Writing Program at Oregon Law and an early Chair of the AALS Section on Legal Writing, Reasoning, and Research. For her scholarship and her pioneering work in legal writing education, Mary received the first Distinguished Service Award from the AALS Section on Legal Writing, Reasoning, and Research; the inaugural Marjorie Rombauer Award from ALWD; a joint LWI/ALWD Lifetime Achievement Award; and the Burton Award for Outstanding Contributions to Legal Writing Education.



2018 RECIPIENT: KATHLEEN ELLIOTT VINSON

Kathleen Elliott Vinson is the recipient of the 2018 Mary S. Lawrence Award. Kathy is a Professor of Legal Writing and the Director of Legal Writing, Research, and Written Advocacy at Suffolk University Law School. She has long been a leader in our field in both criteria for this award. Kathy is co-author of two books on legal writing, *Legal Analysis: The Fundamental Skill* (with David Romantz) and *Mindful Lawyering: The Key to Creative Problem Solving* (with Shailini George and Samantha Moppett), and she has published numerous articles on legal writing pedagogy. Kathy has also been energetic with innovations at Suffolk's nationally ranked program: developing writing and research across the curriculum; enhancing the status of the legal writing faculty; and forging relationships between the law school and practitioners.
