






University Invests in Business Law Program








Moot Court Team makes it to semifinals of national law school tax challenge




Business Law Clinic Expands to Portland




Recent Alumna Lands Job with San Antonio Spurs


Recent Alumna Joins Top New York Financial Services Law Firm


Summer Sports Law Institute will be held July 5 - August 5, 2022
